Nathan Williams Attempts to Intimidate Protestors Outside the Glynn County Courthouse

Protestors gathered this morning outside the Glynn County Courthouse to protest the Williams Family corruption and control of the judicial system in Glynn County, and to support Joe Iannicelli's stance in defying this corruption.

The corruption centers around the Williams Family control of the judicial system in Glynn County. There is no courtroom in the State of Georgia except the Glynn County Courthouse where people can't enter the courtroom in a T Shirt. Chief Judge Williams deprives persons from entering a courtroom in Glynn County without a shirt with a collar.

Joe Iannicelli is not in the Glynn County Jail to protest the arrogant elitist dress code that Chief Judge Commander Williams enforces but he is in the Glynn County Jail to protest the financial corruption of the Williams Family.

Chief Judge "Commander" Williams owns the law office that her son, Nathan Williams uses as his law office and pays her rent to use.

Nathan Williams takes legal cases that are in the Superior Court of Glynn County when he receives a percent of what he gets from a settlement or trial of the case. A part of the money that Nathan Williams gets is paid to Chief Judge Commander Williams in the form of rent. This is political and judicial corruption.

As the lawfully gathered protestors displayed signs which called attention to the Williams Family corruption, Nathan Williams and his law partner, Jason Clark came over in person to flex Nathan Williams' mother's muscles in an attempt to intimidate the lawful protesters, taking their pictures and threatening to subpoena them to testify at a hearing.

Nathan Williams followed the walking protestors around in his pickup truck as they circled the courthouse. One of the protestors asked Nathan Williams, since he appeared to be so interested in what they were doing, if he wanted one of their leaflets. Nathan replied, "You certainly are bold, I'll give you that" from his open truck window.

What Nathan Williams cannot understand is that as long as unethical practices by Chief Judge Williams and her family deprive people of their rights in the Superior Court of Glynn County, people have a right to protest. The intimidation by Chief Judge Williams and Nathan Williams must come to an end.

The only way Nathan Williams can make a living in Glynn County is by riding on the robe-tails of his mother, Chief Judge Amanda "Commander" Williams, who elicits attorneys to refer her son business, and rewards those who do.
